ACLU: Learn more about how to exercise voting rights, resist voter intimidation efforts and access disability-related accommodations and language assistance at the polls.

Ballot Ready: Ballot Ready helps voters register, make a plan to vote and look up their elected representatives. It provides personalized, non-partisan information to voters, ensuring constituents are informed on every race and measure on their ballot.

Brennan Center for Justice: An independent, non-partisan law and policy organization that works to reform, revitalize and, when necessary, defend our country's systems of democracy and justice.

Can I Vote: A non-partisan website was created by state election officials to help eligible voters figure out how and where to go vote.

Civic Alliance: A non-partisan alliance of businesses working together to build a future where everyone participates in shaping our country.

ElectionDay.org: ElectionDay.org calls on corporate America to reject efforts to make voting more difficult and to commit to non-partisan actions that demonstrate a commitment to democracy.

Election Protection: The national, non-partisan coalition works year-round to ensure all voters have an equal opportunity to vote and have that vote count. Provides state-by-state information on where, when and how to vote.

FactCheck.org: A non-partisan, non-profit "consumer advocate" for voters that aims to reduce deception and confusion in U.S. politics.



Fair Elections Center: A national, non-partisan voting rights and election reform organization working to remove barriers to registration and voting, particularly for disenfranchised, underrepresented and marginalized communities.

Time to Vote: A non-partisan, business-led initiative to help ensure employees across America don't have to choose between voting and earning a paycheck.

United States Election Assistance Commission: Sign up to vote. Each state and territory administers elections differently. Use this tool to find key dates and voting information about federal elections in all states and territories.

Vote.org: Helps voters to register, verify their registration, request a mail-in ballot, sign up for election reminders, find their polling location and stay current on the laws or policies that affect their ability to vote.

Voting Rights Alliance: A non-partisan network of organizations, activists and legislators working to restore and protect voting rights from attempts to undermine access to the polls and to have votes fairly counted.
